

## Recommended Bible Reading Guide

Reading from four places in the Bible:

1. Old Testament - Wisdom books (Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, Songs of Songs)
  2. Old Testament - other
  3. Gospels and Acts
  4. New Testament - other
- Read one chapter in each place most days or a verse or two from each place
  - Read through all sections and then begin again
  - In the Old Testament other section, flip flop from Genesis to Job and Isaiah to Malachi
  - Use post-it tabs to keep a track of where you are up to.

### Great Statistics

If you read one chapter most days:

- You would read the Psalms and Wisdom literature nearly twice a year
- You would read the Gospels and Acts three times a year
- You would read the Rest of the New Testament two & half times
- You would read through the Rest of the Old Testament every two years

So in two years:

- Whole Bible
- Psalms & Wisdom literature nearly four times
- Gospels & Acts six times
- Rest of New Testament four times

### Benefits

- No catching up because not dated
- Gives room to read more
- Room to focus on a Bible book for a while
- Allows you to linger if you want to...
